Our newest home, located at [3760 Metropolis Lake Road](#) in West Paducah, Kentucky, began worship services in late 2006. The land on which this church was built was donated by Julian Carroll, a West Paducah native and the 54th Governor of the State of Kentucky.

We strive to be good neighbors for those around us and work in partnership with surrounding school districts and organizations as it relates to the use of the church building and grounds.

From a safety standpoint, the building has been designed to meet fire and building codes for churches. We also strive to make sure there is access to items for a medical emergency. Evacuation routes/safety zones are posted in each room in the building.

Milburn Chapel works to provide a secure building/grounds, with the support of church security volunteers and security camera surveillance, as well as good working relationship with law enforcement and emergency personnel.

Milburn Chapel has a dedicated team of volunteers to help repair or replace any equipment or materials that may become damaged or unusable. We also have individuals that help maintain the grounds around the church.

Once or twice a year, Milburn Chapel offers a “Work Day” in which interested individuals can help with landscaping or minor repairs inside or outside the church building.
